POPULATION BASED END OF LIFE CARE

Most people approaching the end of life are cared for by frontline generalist teams. At the same time, many specialist palliative care services are overstretched and unable to reach everyone who could benefit from quality 'gold standard' care and support at the end of their lives.

GOLD CARE AFRICA provides a structured, supported, step-by-step approach to developing the palliative and end-of-life care skills of the generalist workforce, working in partnership with specialist teams and adapting to local needs and contexts. Building on the UK's Gold Standards Framework, Gold Care Africa equips frontline teams to deliver proactive, person-centred, coordinated care for more people nearing the end of life.

the frontline workforce at the bedside, Gold Care Africa strengthens professional confidence and competence, helping to improve the quality and consistency of care. The programme enables more people and their families to receive 'gold standard' care in the final stage of life, helping them to live as well as possible until they die.



Requirement criteria for application

- Hospital teams interested in this pioneering pilot, with enthusiasm to innovate locally
- Keen to develop new approaches to quality end of life care in your hospital /community
- Two wards / hospital – preferably general medical wards (not only palliative/hospices)
- Gold Care lead, deputy and 1-2 champions from each ward
- Commitment to attend each monthly webinar x8 and symposium
- Willing to submit baseline and follow up evaluations as part of research, and homework tasks between workshops, with support from your senior team/board.
- Work towards self-sustaining embedded, extended Gold Care in your area
